KWH is a community-focused non-profit organization supporting newcomers, refugees, youth, women, families, seniors and equity-deserving communities. We connect people with practical learning, employment and entrepreneurship pathways, community supports and opportunities to contribute.

Our work is rooted in compassion and the belief that people thrive when they have access to relevant skills, trusted relationships and pathways that respect their dignity and potential.

2025 program highlights

Employment and entrepreneurship pathways

KWH advanced a Job and Career Fair model designed to connect job seekers, newcomers and entrepreneurs with employers, business mentors, resume and interview support, financial-literacy learning and entrepreneurship resources. Public event communications promoted business and career fair activity in Toronto during 2025.

Senior wellbeing and social connection

KWH promoted senior-wellbeing programming focused on connection, meaningful conversation, shared activities and respect for older adults. This work supported the development of a clearer seniors support and wellbeing stream.

KWH Academy

KWH Academy strengthened the organization's education and workforce-development direction. Its public learning model emphasized short, career-focused courses, practical assessments and immediate workplace application. Published program areas included Shelter Support Worker, Intensive Case Management and professional development, alongside digital and entrepreneurship learning.

A stronger program framework

By year end, KWH's public direction increasingly connected community empowerment with structured pathways in workforce integration, entrepreneurship and procurement, digital skills, skilled trades and seniors support. This framework positioned KWH to deepen partnerships, improve outcome measurement and design more targeted programs for Toronto communities.

What we learned

- People benefit when career preparation is linked directly to employers, mentors and practical next steps.
- Entrepreneurship support is stronger when business planning, procurement readiness, financial literacy and ecosystem connections are combined.
- Accessible, culturally responsive delivery is essential for newcomers, youth, seniors and equity-deserving communities.
- Consistent outcome tracking and participant follow-up are necessary to demonstrate long-term impact.

Stewardship and financial transparency

KWH's accountability approach emphasizes approved budgets, documented spending, restricted-fund tracking, appropriate authorization, reliable records and periodic leadership oversight. Detailed financial statements are not reproduced in this public impact report. Financial records are maintained for governance, funder, accounting and legal review as applicable.

Priorities carried into 2026

- Deepen skilled-trades and workforce-development pathways.
- Expand KWH Academy's job-ready and frontline-service training.
- Strengthen seniors wellbeing, newcomer integration and youth opportunity.
- Build employer, community, education and funding partnerships.
- Improve governance, accessibility, safeguarding, privacy and impact-reporting systems.
